

Bus Behavior

As we all know, education is the number one priority. Along a different line, having your child remain safe while here at school is also our number one priority. I am very concerned with the safety of your child as well as the safety of all children who ride the buses to and from school. It seems like a growing number of students have forgotten the proper rules while riding on the bus. I have had to go on many of the buses and remind the children of the proper bus rules. Please review the following rules with your child:

Stay Seated, Face forward, Speak in a soft voice, Keep your hands to yourself

With everyone's cooperation, we can make sure that all students arrive at school and go home safely. If there isn't any improvement, I will be forced to remove various students from riding the bus and the family will be required to provide transportation to and from school.

Dress Code

As stated in the handbook, students should always dress appropriately for school and for the season. The following are never permitted at school:

Short shorts, Spandex clothes, Tank tops, Muscle shirts, Bare midriffs, Chains, Clothing with offensive messages, Bandanas, Rubber thong sandals, Flip-flop sandals

If a child wears inappropriate clothing, he or she will be required to change. This is being done to avoid any embarrassment for the children. Many students are wearing pants or shirts that are either too big or too small. Please make sure your child is properly dressed before they leave for school. We have also had a number of issues in the health office due to students getting hurt as a result of broken flip-flops, toes getting stepped on, etc. Our *recommendation* is for students to wear some sort of tennis shoe.
