School-Parent Involvement Policy

Parents, staff, and students of Green Valley Primary School will work together as partners to ensure the best possible education for all students. This includes working together to plan, design, implement, and evaluate the educational programs at Green Valley Primary School.

To accomplish this goal, Green Valley Primary will do the following to involve parents in the joint development of its school parental involvement plan under the Title 1 Parent Involvement section of the No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB).

- Host an annual open house meeting at the beginning of the school year to inform parents of the school's participation in the Title 1 program and to explain the requirements and their right to be involved.
- Provide frequent reports about their child's progress. This can be in person, telephone, or through electronic mail
- Provide parents and staff an opportunity to evaluate the Title I Program and have input in its implementation
- Provide opportunity to define, plan and utilize the school-parent compact and explain how the entire school staff and students will share in the responsibility for improved student achievement
- Solicit opinions/interests of parents at PTO and Title I meetings
- Provide assistance to parents in understanding the Dibels Testing scores administered to students in grades K – 2.
- Will regularly communicate to parents and the regular classroom teacher on the child's progress.
- Provide a needs assessment questionnaire/survey to parents of all Title I students at the end of the school year.

Green Valley Primary School will provide materials and training to help parents work with their children to improve their children's academic achievement by

- Holding meetings throughout the year to address parental questions/concerns.
- Conducting informative sessions concerning expectations of students.
- Providing strategies for parents that will assist in the improvement of their child's education experiences.
- Providing after-school tutoring.

- Encouraging students to participate in the school’s Accelerated Reader Program, Odyssey Program and 25-Book Challenge.
- Providing books and materials to students and parents.
- Encouraging access to technological programs such as harcourtschool.com and various learning websites provided by the school staff.
- Accessing the East Allegheny curriculum based on PA state standards, located on the PDE website as well as the East Allegheny High School main office.
- Collaborate with pre-school programs, such as Head Start and Even Start.

The school will invite all parents of children participating in Title I, Part A programs to meetings and will encourage them to attend by

- Providing childcare.
- Sending home written reminders.
- Asking for parental input through the use of an evaluation tool.
- Holding an annual Open House.
- Holding parent conferences during both day and evening hours.
- Arranging school meetings at a variety of times.
- Annual culminating activity.
