

PRIDE at EA

- PRIDE will be followed in all areas of the school based on specific rules and expectations.
- These rules and expectations will be in the form of a matrix.
- Currently we have healthy habits, hallway, and Cafeteria completed. Technology will be next. Bus and Classroom will follow next.
- A google form acknowledgement system is being used by all school personnel to reward students who are following the matrix.
- Student Team and Community involvement are also being developed.

Behavioral Matrix



Defines the expected behaviors for specific settings

Defines the procedures for specific settings



Creates the curriculum that will guide the teaching of expected behaviors.



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PBIS Positive Behavior Interventions SUpport

PBIS OVERVIEW

- Proactive approach to improve school safety and promote positive behavior.
- The focus of PBIS is to prevent undesired behaviors rather than punishing students after the negative behavior has occurred.
 - Students are taught expected behaviors for each school setting using common language by all staff.





PBIS OVERVIEW OF TIERS OF SUPPORT


Tier 1- Students learn basic expected behaviors, they are rewarded, recognized and praised by staff for demonstrating this expected behavior.

























Acknowledge Students Meeting Expectations


