Dear Parent(s)/Guardian(s):

East Allegheny will be administering the Pennsylvania System of School Assessments (PSSA) during the month of April for 4 day students, as the U.S. Department of Education (USDE) recently announced that federal assessments will <u>not</u> be waived for the 2020-2021school year.

Following that announcement, the Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE) indicated that schools will have flexibility as to when testing may occur, and schools could delay until as late as September of 2021. East Allegheny School District believes that testing students at the end of the school year, rather than over the summer or in the fall, provides our students with the best opportunity to be successful on their required exams.

We understand that the pandemic has created incredibly challenging circumstances for so many of our families, and we regret that high stakes testing during this time may add to the burden felt by our community. We acknowledge the exceptionally difficult conditions under which students will be testing, but we are required to adhere to state and federal mandates.

Please emphasize the importance of your child attending school on these dates and bringing their charged Chromebooks (with chargers), as testing will occur online. It is also very important that students are well rested and provided a healthy breakfast prior to testing. As a reminder, breakfast is available every day to all EA students at no cost.

4 DAY ASSESSMENT DATES

Grade Level Grade level	Assessment	Dates
7th & 8th	ELA English Language Arts	April 26 & 27
7th & 8th	Math Mathematics	April 29 & 30
8 th	Science	May 3 & 4

All students in grades 7-8 will take the ELA and Mathematics exams. On those testing dates, assessments will be administered during the first two periods of the day. The science assessment will be administered to eighth grade students during the first 2 periods of the day.
